Put these 5 essentials into practice for your family:



Maximize Structure

- Create a daily schedule
- Establish routines for work



Child Engagement

- Use child's interests, preferences & choices
- Plan for active & inactive times



Expectations & Rules

- Develop 'a way to be together' as a family
- Identify behaviors you want to see



Provide Positive Feedback

- Praise behaviors you want to see
- Use frequently during problem times



Respond Calmly to Inappropriate Behaviors

- Use neutral tone of voice to correct behavior
- Identify ways to respond to common problems
